Summary of EYPP Spending in Academic Year 2015-16

Objectives in spending EYPP

- The gap between EYPP and non EYPP pupils closes in all 7 areas of learning.
- EYPP pupils are on track to gain a Good Level of Development (GLD) at the end of EYFS.
- For all pupils to make at least 4 steps progress in all specific areas of learning during the nursery year 2015-2016.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Purchase the Black Sheep Press Packs (x2) Cost - £88

Black Sheep Press (Language through listening) – Assessment time and TA small group activities

Black Sheep Press (Nursery Narrative Pack) – Assessment time and TA small group activities

Planning and preparation time for yoga , C&L and trips out sessions

Weekly ½ hour sessions of yoga

Provide a school dinner and extend the learning time in nursery. (1 per week)Cost - £100

Work as part of a small group and visit local places to widen experiences.

Gardening activities in small groups to improve communication skills and understanding of the world

Work 1:1 or within a small group to ensure school readiness. This will focus on independence and self-help skills.

Costing for a TA to run each session is £13 per hour. Most of the allocated budget was spent on staffing enabling a TA to work with the children or TA to cover the teacher for them to work with the children.

Outcomes

The work undertaken for the EYPP children has proved effective especially in the focus areas of the World, where EYPP children have outperformed non-EYPP children by 4.9% and in Communication and Language where the gap had now reduced to 4.2%. 72.7% of children reached age related expectation in all areas of Communication and Language and 81.8% of children reached age related expectations in The World. EYPP children made an average of over 4 points progress in all specific areas except Understanding where they made an average of 3.64pts. Children made good progress in terms of school readiness against the school checklist and reports from local primary schools show that they believe that they were ready for school.
